TOURIST TIPS FOR A MEMORABLE VISIT

Visitor Information Center: To learn more about Marietta and the surrounding area, visit the Marietta-Washington County Convention & Visitors Bureau at 241 Front Street Suite 7, Marietta, Ohio 45750. Contact them at 740-373-5178. They're open from 8 am to 6 pm Monday to Friday and from 10 am to 3 pm on Saturdays.

Shuttle Service & Parking: There will be free parking at the Washington County Fairgrounds. Wasco, Inc. will provide a shuttle service sponsored by Yellow Taxi on September 6th and 7th. The shuttle will make rounds between the Washington County Fairgrounds (922 Front Street), the Valley Gem (601 Front Street), and Tiber Way (Butler Street, between Front Street and Second Street). A shuttle will leave Tiber Way each half-hour or when it reaches capacity. On Friday, September 7th, the shuttle will run from 6 pm to 11 pm. On Saturday,

September 8th, the shuttle will run from 8 am to Midnight. Troop 207 of Scouts BSA will manage paid handicap and other parking on Friday and Saturday, on 2nd Street between Greene St. and Butler St. Additional parking will be available Friday and Saturday on Green Street, between 2nd St. and 3rd St. managed by the Reno Christian Youth Group.

Hotel Shuttle: Some local hotels offer a free shuttle service for their guests. Inquire with your hotel for details about service timings and availability.

Camping Information: If you're an outdoor enthusiast, camping and camper spaces are available to purchase for the weekend. Please note that this is dry primitive camping without sewer, water, campfires, or alcohol. Camping is permitted from Thursday at 6 pm until Sunday at 6 pm.

Grounds Regulations: Within the Festival grounds, please observe the rules: pets,

bicycles, skates, skateboards, rollerblades, alcohol, drugs, and unauthorized weapons are not permitted.

Boat Etiquette: Respect the captains' authority and seek permission before boarding the Sternwheelers.





1. BRANDY LYNN

The current owners, Andrew and Emily Barr & Scott and Kathy Barr, purchased the Brandy Lynn in 2015. She is 50 feet long and 12.5 feet wide. She is powered by a 4-cylinder Isuzu diesel engine. She has a hydraulic primary drive and a chain and sprocket final drive. The Brandy Lynn's home port is Nitro, WV mile marker 44 on the Kanawha River.

2. BETTY LOU

The sternwheeler, Betty Lou, was built at the Old Lock 7 in Georgetown, Pennsylvania on the Ohio River mile 36.5 in 1998. The hull is all steel construction. It is 100' x 20' x 6'. She has three decks, a kitchen, a living room, four bedrooms, and three bathrooms. She is fully air-conditioned and uses electric heat. The main power is 175 H.P. Cummins. The Betty Lou also has a 40 k.w. generator. The Betty Lou was built by Captain Bub Crain and named the Betty Lou in honor of his wife. Bub and Betty Lou owned the boat through their lifetime. Close boating friends of the Crains, the DeMent family, acquired her in August 2021. Rick and Dana DeMent serve as co-captains with their first-mates and wives, Rachelle and Jennifer.

3. CELLY MARIE

Proudly owned by Rachelle & Rick Dement.

4. CLAIRE E

The Claire E was built in 1926 by Dravo Contracting Co, Neville Island, PA (hull) and

Clyde Paden and JC Williamson, Sardis, Ohio. Reb 1967, Fly, Ohio. 114x18 hull (90x16) GM 4-71 diesel repowered 1967 100hp Ong towboat Diesel owned by builders. Sold May 1939 to Monongahala and Ohio Dredging Co, Pittsburgh. Sold February 1960 to Beaver, PA Towing Co. Sold 1962 to Seneca Towing Co, Pittsburgh. Sold 1966, renamed 1967 by Mr. and Mrs. Gene Fitch. Captains Rick and Rachelle Dement have taken her into their fleet and hope to preserve the Claire E history.


5. DIANA JEAN

The unique wooden hull boat, originally name the G.D. Eddy, was built in 1980 by Red Curtis and Eddie Darbous. At 25' long and 8' wide, she was steered by a 5' diameter wheel and powered by a Redwing Marine engine. In 1983, she was sold to Joe and Dianne Lockhart and renamed the Jody L. In 1985, she was sold to Jim and Judy Linger and renamed the Little Dipper. Many renovations were done at this time including; extending the paddle wheel, installing a steel hull, and replacing the Redwing Marine with a Chrysler slant six engine. These additions extended her length to 50' in length and 12' in width! In 2009, she was sold to Robert McIntosh Sr. and renamed the Diana Jean in memory of his eldest daughter. In 2010, the Diana Jean was revamped with new pine wood siding and pine floors. All the boards were cut and planed from a friends portable saw mill. This

addition extended the upper deck by 2 feet! The Diana Jean also received a new generator and hydraulic steering with the help of family and friends. In 2013, Captain Bob passed away and passed ownership of the Diana Jean to his son-in-law and youngest daughter, Doug and Mary Ellen Lowe. In January of 2016 the Diana Jean took on water and sank in the shallow waters of the Muskingum River, where she was moored. Once again with a lot of help from family and friends she was quickly raised and dry docked. The Diana Jean has been completely gutted and remodeled. The hull has been expanded to 18' wide with all new steel. The inside has been beautifully redesigned with an open floor plan. The new design includes a kitchen island, full sized stainless refrigerator and stove, new cabinets with lots of storage, a bedroom with a queen sized bed, and antique sliding barn doors. New steps were built to access the upper deck, where family and friends love to gather. Doug has reluctantly but proudly accepted the position as Captain. The family is certain Robert McIntosh Sr. would be elated and proud of what the Diana Jean is today. Sail on in heaven's river "Captain Bob", and rest easy knowing the Diana Jean is in safe loving hands.

6. DIXIE

The Dixie was built in 1937 by The Nashville Bridge Company for Capt. Frank W. Paden of Sardis, OH. She has been sold several times:



1937 Standard Sand and Gravel of Wheeling, WV, January 1966 to W.L. Johnson Towing Co. of Shippingsport, PA, 1971 to Sidney E. Johnson of Beaver Falls, PA, and October 1975 to Primo and Captain Jan DiCarlo of East Liverpool, OH. The Dixie was rebuilt in 1982 by Captain John Beatty Marine Services, Inc., of Warsaw, KY as a special gift boat from Primo DiCarlo to his wife, Captain Jan DiCarlo. She is a small version of the famous Delta Queen. The Dixie was sold again in 1998 to Captain "Heck" Heckert and Sheila Diane Heckert and has been restored as a modern day structuring of the original Dixie of 1937. The Heckert Fleet has been to many Sternwheel Festivals for over 30 years and continues to allow guests aboard for pictures at many of these events. Brothers and Sisters of the Heckert Fleet include P. A. Denny, M/V Sheila "D", Leviathan, G.D. Eddy, Old Glory, Capt. "H", Wild Goose, Tammy White, Oliver Merrill, Sam P. Sue, Henny Cook, Casino Boat M/V Speculation (Capt. "Heck" Heckert). Whenever you see The Dixie docked, take a picture and visit a while.

7. DONNA REA

Owner: Jim and Jean Kranz Home Port: Charleston, WV Hull: Scow Bow, 20' spoonbill scow, 21' 6" mid-body section, stern rake 15' 6". The hull is constructed from 5/16" steel on the bow compartment, 1/4" steel mid-body and stern. It has 3 water tight compartments. Hull Size: Length - 57 feet, Width - 16 feet, Draft - 30 inches. Overall length - 74 feet. Paddlewheel: Diameter - 14 feet, Width - 8' 6": 16 wooden buckets | Engine: 471 Detroit Diesel | Drive Train: Belt and Chain: 5.9:1 Tonan gear box, Woods coupling between gear box and cog belt. 4" wide cog belt to 120 chain to a 180 final drive chain. Builder: The Donna Rae was built by John N. Fadeley and family at home in Robinson Twp., PA. Construction started in May of 1984 and was completed May 10, 1988. Superstructure: The cabin of the Donna Rae is made of steel and finished out with a wood interior. Misc: The Donna Rae is equipped with a 480 gallon fresh water tank, 600 gallon fuel tank and a Kubota Diesel 7 KW gen set.

8. DRESDEN BELLE

Carl Deaton, Captain and Owner, purchased the Dresden Belle in 1998. She was built in 1988 with Carl being the 3rd owner. The boat is white with black trim, 83 feet in length plus the 16-foot stage and the beam is 16 feet. The boat drafts 21 inches. The range is 900 miles and has a 400-gallon fuel capacity and 600-gallon water capacity. Carl has completely redone the engine and engine room. A 5.9 Cummins Diesel powers the Dresden Belle. Cruise speed is 7.5 miles per hour at 1500 rpm. The fuel burn is 3 gallons per hour at 1500 rpm. The boat is a continuous work in progress. The crew consists of Connie

Hines, 1st mate, and Mascot, Cuddles.

9. E. L. THUMPER

Jack Bedeck and friends built the E.L. Thumper in 1979 in his front yard in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. It has undergone many changes since then. Its overall length is 75 feet and it is 16 feet wide with a model bow and lots of sheer. The Thumper is powered by a 460 cu. in. Ford gasoline engine. The wheel size is 15 feet in diameter by eight feet wide with twelve buckets. The Thumper's home port is mile 3.3 on the Allegheny River at Hammill's Landing, Millvale, Pennsylvania.

10. FARIS WHEEL

John and Cheryl Thomas of Syracuse, Ohio built the Faris Wheel Sternwheeler. It took John two years to build the boat, completing it in 1996. Its current owners, Tom and Loretta Faris, purchased the boat in the Fall of 2001 and launched her in the Spring of 2002. The Faris Wheel is docked at The Gallipolis Boat Club on the Chickamauga Creek, Gallipolis, Ohio. Her overall length is 50' with a beam of 14'. The Faris Wheel is powered by a 363 cubic inch Ford 6 cylinder diesel engine through a hydraulic pump and a 4-1 ratio gear reduction hydraulic motor (no chain). The wheel is 8' in diameter and 8' wide. The main engine and 6.5KW generator is under the front deck and exhausts through the stack. The swim platform and stacks



were added in 2004 and the stainless steel haul (to water line) added in 2007.

11. FRANKY D

Built in 1984 by Donald Burden, originally named the Gracie L., renamed Michael J in 1996 by Wayne and Jean Leidy of Barberton, Ohio. Rick and Rachelle DeMent of Rayland, Ohio, purchased the boat in 2009 and the boat has been renamed the Franky D. Steve and Gina Cox purchased the boat in September, 2021. As of July 4, 2024, Jim Hysel of Middleport, OH is the current owner. Length: 65 feet | Beam: 15 ft. | Draft: 22 inches | Engine: 1160, V8 Cat Diesel | Horsepower: 215 | Allison auto transmission to belt reduction to chain driven wheel. | Fuel capacity: 140 gallons | Water capacity: 250 gallons | Onan 6000 wt. generator | Sleeps four | Home port: Rayland Marina, Rayland, Ohio

12. HENNY COOK

The Henny Cook was renamed in 1982 to honor the longtime treasurer of the Charleston Festival Commission and mother of Thomas Cook of Dunbar, WV. Roland and Charles Montague of Ashland, KY originally built the HENNY COOK as the LUCY COLES in 1959. Her original 20 hp steam engine was repowered in 1963 with a Chrysler gas engine with a 67:1 reduction. She sold in 1975 to Ollie Adkins of Gallipolis, OH, and then sold again in 1977 to Jim Thalet. In

1981, she was sold to Tom Cook and Nelson Jones (deceased) and repowered with an Oldsmobile diesel engine, 120 hp. Ownership was transferred completely to Tom Cook in 1985. She then changed owners to Duke and Christy Grant, then to Jacob Grant, all of Dunbar, WV, then to Cory Fagan of Nitro, WV. Her current owners are Kenneth and Jessica Terry, also of Nitro, WV.

13. HOBBY III

The current owners are J. D. & Becky Pauley. Her home port is the "Port of Indecisions", Nitro, WV, Kanawha River Mile Marker 47.2RDB. Her hull is all steel with 1/4" bow and stern with 1/2" overlays. Sides and bottom are 3/16". The hull is scow bow with 5 watertight compartments and a 12" x 20' scag in the center. The old hull was removed and this new one installed in 2000. The Hobby has 4 rudders. The current hull size is 16' W x 65' L x 34" D sides with a 3" deadrise in the bottom. The paddlewheel is 10' x 8' with 2"x12" treated pine bucket boards. The current engine is a 150 hp Caterpillar, 3056 turbo diesel. The Hobby has a Velvet Drive 72C, 1.51:1 reduction transmission coupled to a V-belt reduction wheel which is coupled to a 6:1 Western reducing gear box and to the paddlewheel with a #160 chain. The late Captain Harry Wilson began building the Hobby in 1977 in Belpre, Ohio. It was finally launched in 1985. It was rehauled by J.D. Pauley & Denny Dawson. The Hobby


has a wooden superstructure with the lower cabin area measuring 12' W x 44' L. The boat sleeps four downstairs. Two on a pull-out couch and two in the bedroom. The recently renovated 10' W x 23' L Pilothouse/ Texas cabin also sleeps four. The Hobby has a full bath and a complete kitchen with propane stove. She also has central air and heat. The Hobby has an 8 KW Kubota diesel generator and holds 210 gallons of fresh water, 250 gallons of diesel fuel and has a 110 gallon holding tank. The pilothouse is also radar equipped and has a Garmin GPS system. The entire boat is protected with a rather sophisticated security system.

14. JENNY B

Rick and Debbie Burden are the owners of the Jenny B which they built in 1988 along with their sons, Matt and Jarrod. She is named after Debbie's mother, Jenny Beckett. 17 feet wide by 80 feet long, the vessel's 14-foot paddle wheel is powered by a 6 BT Cummins engine, a ZF 63 transmission and a V-Belt to the twin chain drives. She has the capacity to carry 600 gallons of fresh water and 1000 gallons of fuel. All aboard relax very comfortably inside, which sleeps 8, has 1 ½ baths along with central heating and air conditioning. Her home port is Rayland Marina on the Ohio River at mile marker 81.3.

15. JOF S.

The Joe S. was built in 1986 by Tucker Marine



steel hull & superstructure; overall dimensions are 84' in length by 20'5" wide with a draft of 20". The wheel is chain driven, all steel construction with a width of 16' and a total of 12 buckets, powered by a 6-cylinder Perkins 6-354 turbo diesel engine. The Joe S has one stateroom with a large walk-in closet, 1.5 bathrooms, washer/dryer, a complete galley (including a dishwasher!), and a spacious living area. The sizable pilothouse includes modern electronics such as radar to navigate in restricted visibility, depth sounder, marine VHF radios, satellite compass to determine exact position and heading, and an AIS transponder to share the vessel's position and speed with other vessels operating in the area. Originally named Columbia, Gordon & Marilyn Tucker lived aboard this vessel in the Cincinnati area from 1986 until they sold it in 1994. Following 1994 she was home ported in St. Paul, MN and at various locations along the Tennessee River under prior ownership. Her endeavors under former ownership includes hosting lakeside concerts including tall scaffolds of speakers at Pickwick, TN and she even completed a round trip to Key West, FL! She was sold in December 2020 to the Neale family of Vienna, WV. Capt. C.R. Neale III and Capt. Steve Price completed the 968-mile journey in August 2021 to bring the Joe S. to her new home port of Vienna, WV. The Joe S. is the newest boat that has

joined the fleet of towboats owned by the Neale family, owners of Neale Marine Transportation & Fleeting. Along with delivering raw materials to local chemical plants, aggregate yards, and petroleum terminals, Neale Marine Transportation & Fleeting is committed to providing transportation services for the Sternwheel Festival's stage and fireworks barges each year. If you see any of the fleet of 9 yellow & green towboats passing the city front of Marietta, be sure to give our crews a big wave...we will probably wave back and might even provide a horn salute!

16. JUANITA

The Juanita is owned by Tommy & Lakin Cook of Dunbar, West Virginia. It was built in 1954 by O. F. Shearer & Sons in an empty coal hopper barge at Cedar Grove, WV-mile 76.6 on the Kanawha River. When she was finished, the hopper barge was floated onto a dry dock and raised out of the water. Holes were cut into the hopper barge, then it was sunk from underneath the JUANITA. Plans for this boat consisted of a sketch drawn on a wall calendar. The JUANITA was built to replace a wooden hull towboat that was also named JUANITA. The 1st one was built in 1928 as the ESTELL II at Madison, Ind. The ESTELL II was the second boat in a long line of boats owned by O. F. Shearer & Sons that stretched from the early 1900's to 1973. The primary duties of the JUANITA

were servicing the Shearer landing at Cedar Grove, WV and coal landing docks on the upper Kanawha River. The JUANITA and the rest of the Shearer operations were sold in 1973 to Indiana & Michigan Power Co. In 1976, their base of operation was moved to Lakin, WV --mile 257.2 on the Ohio River. The Cooks purchased the boat in 1994 and returned it to the Kanawha River after a nearly twenty year absence. When it was purchased, the boat needed extensive renovation work. There were no living facilities. The bedroom, bathroom, kitchen and living room areas were added. No changes were made to the outside appearance. The hull has been sandblasted and coated with Coal Tar epoxy. The paddlewheel was rebuilt and made one foot larger in diameter. The three original steering rudders were replaced with two new ones. The toughest part of the renovation was removing 19 tons of river gravel ballast from the bow rake compartment. All this gravel was removed by hand using plastic buckets (approx. 450). This ballast was replaced with 6 tons of steel placed as close to the head of the boat as possible. Its hull is a scull bow, steel hull, three compartments, hull was re-plated in 1984 with 1/4" plate. All hull framing is 'extra heavy'. The hull size is 64' x 16.5' x 3.9' Overall 80' x 16.5' x 3.9'. Its paddlewheel is 12' wide x 12' diameter, 12 buckets, 24"



dip, 1" oak boards with a hexagon shaft. The engine is a Detroit Diesel 6-71 which is naturally aspirated. Its drive train is a Twin Disc MG 166 reversing gear with 4.5 to 1 ratio. Link Belt Silent Chain drives to 4 7/16" jackshaft with # 200 chain to paddlewheel. Most of the machinery (engine, gear, drive train, steering system & paddlewheel) was transferred from the 1st JUANITA. It has hydraulic steering with two main & two monkey rudders controlled by steering levers instead of a pilotwheel. The superstructure has one deck, all steel construction, bath and shower area, kitchen & dining area, one bedroom.

17. KANAWHA

The Kanawha was built in 1937 as a single screw towboat by Eddie Erlbacher of Cape Girardeau, MO. Kanawha has had several owners over the years. R. C. Heckert converted her to a towboat style sternwheeler in 1985. In 1998, she was sold to Frank and Pam Fink. She was then completely renovated. Her current owners, Duke and Christy Grant, have made several changes and renovations since 2014. Her home port is Nitro, WV.

18. KATIE H

The Katie H was built in 1932 at Cape Girardeau, Missouri, by Eddie Erlbacher. Christened as the "Owassa" and later named CIS-5, she worked the Pittsburgh area rivers as a commercial tow boat for U. S. Steel, Clarion Works until 1960. Vince Hammill, purchased the boat in 1962 and reconstructed her into a sternwheel boat and named it after his mother, now the Katie H. Bryan Hughes, now the owner and captain, purchased her from Vinnie in 2019. The Katie H is 82 feet long with a beam of 17 feet. The wheel is 15 x 10 feet and has a draft of 4.5 feet. She is powered by a General Motors 6-71 Detroit Diesel engine with 165hp. She has a full-size bath with tub, galley and bar area along with a Texas cabin and is a full-time live aboard. Recent remodeling has also added water making capabilities and wireless Internet. In 1984 the Katie H was in the movie "Mrs. Soffel" with Diane Keaton and in 1985 she appeared in "Silent Witness" with Valerie Bertinelli. The Katie H currently resides at mile marker 61 on the Kanawha River in Charleston, WV.

19. LADY CARMINA



20. LADY LOIS

Diesel Sternwheel Towboat, 500 hp. Built 1928 Nashville Bridge Co. 100' x 20', 13' x 13' Paddlewheel, Engine: Detroit Diesel 60 Series, Twin Disc red. 3:1, Generator Lister 15 KW, Originally CATHERINE D. 1983 leased to Warner Brothers for filming of TV series "Mississippi". 1996 sold to Madison Coal & Supply Co. Its captain is Capt. John Elkins.

21. LAUREN ELIZABETH

The Lauren Elizabeth is a dream come true for Captain Steve Price. The boat was designed and built by Steve as a tribute to his father, Captain W. H. (Bill) Price. Steve had a lot of good help in building the boat, namely Captain John Fadeley and Steve's father Bill. She was started in 1995, launched in 2001, and cruised to the Marietta Festival in September 2002. At this time the interior was still rough. Steve and his mother, Mary, designed the interior. The interior was finished by festival time in 2005. The Lauren Elizabeth is named after Steve's daughter. She is 125 feet long, 22 feet wide and all steel, including the 18 foot diameter paddle wheel, which is chain driven by a 600 HP Cummins Diesel engine. She has two staterooms, 2.5 bathrooms, a full galley, and a living room. The engine room also includes two diesel generator sets and a laundry area.



22. LE'PORT EXPLORER

Once known as the Port Explorer, she was owned and built by Steve & Bonnie Hutchison of South Point, Ohio (Ohio River mile 312.0R). Construction was started in May, 2005, and she was launched January 27, 2010. The hull is all steel with a model bow and five separate watertight compartments. She was sold to Butch and Angie Leport in September 2018. She was renamed Le'Port Explorer. She is now ported in Gallopolis, Ohio. Length is 74' overall, a beam of 16.5', and draws 2'. Weighing in at about 34 tons, she is powered with a 6-cylinder Cummins diesel (5.9L). The paddlewheel is 10' D x 8' W with 12 buckets. Auxiliary power comes from a 6-kw. diesel generator. She carries 300 gallons of fresh water and 230 gallons of diesel. The cabin is wood, and finished with southern yellow pine bead board. The lower level includes a kitchen/dining area forward, the main salon and bath with shower, a guest stateroom (queen), and the engine room aft. The upper level includes an elevated pilothouse, a half-bath, the owner's stateroom (queen), and a 15' x 20' outdoor "rec room" aft.

23. LIDA ANN

Her hull was built in 1926 and served as an open air passenger ferry near Erie, Pennsylvania. In 1984 she was purchased by new owners and then converted to a side wheel vessel in 1986. The Lida Ann is 51 ft. long by 1 ft. wide, powered by a Cummins 4B

Diesel. She offers the comfort of 1 bedroom, full bath, galley and salon. Her wheels each are 8 ft. by 2 ft. In 2004 she was purchased by Captains Josh and John Scott. The Lida Ann, named in honor of Josh's mother, has seen many beautiful updates making her a unique side wheeler on the Kanawha River. She was recently purchased by Jack Jarrett. Her home port is Charleston, WV.

24. MAJOR

Major is a diesel sternwheel towboat built in 1928 by the Charles Ward Engineering Works of Charleston, WV. It is 85 feet long by 18 feet wide. The paddlewheel is a split wheel design and is driven by chain in the center. It has a 470 horsepower, 60 Series Detroit Diesel engine. The transmission is a twin disc MG514. Kelley's Creek Barge Line originally owned Major. White Brothers Towing purchased it in 1975, after which it sank and sat on the bottom of the river for 7 years. In 1982, Madison Coal and Supply raised it and restored it to a working towboat. In 2016, Major was purchased by Valley Gem, Inc. and will further be restored and upgraded to serve as a UTV for the Miss Lily passenger barge to be put into future service.

25. MISS STERLING

The Miss Sterling was built in 1926 by the Marietta Manufacturing Company in Pt. Pleasant, WV. She was originally named The Marietta until being sold to The Sterling

Oil Company who renamed her The Miss Sterling. She was acquired in 1950 by The Crain Brothers of Pennsylvania, where she continued as a work boat for over thirty years. She was later sold to Tom Jones of Charleston, WV in 1983. At that time, she was retired from service, underwent a complete rebuild from the hull up, and became a regular champion of the Charleston Regatta races. She was sold to Kris Eads of Dunbar, WV in November of 2013, and underwent another extensive rebuild. 

27. MUDSOCK

The "Mudsock" was originally constructed by Carl Wright along Mill Creek in Cottageville, WV, sometime in the mid 1980's. The boat then measured 58' in length with a 14' beam. Robert Cantrell acquired the boat from Mr. Wright in July 1996. The Mudsock was dry-docked and remodeled in 1999, being launched in 2001. The boat's dimensions were increased to 80' in length and 20' in width. It has a modified scow bow, two staterooms, two full heads, a full galley and salon. Powered by a Cummins 855 Big Cam turbo diesel engine coupled to a twin disc transmission. It has a 12'x10' diameter wheel and drafts 36" in depth. It has a 12volt system with four 8D battery storage cells. It has a diesel driven Olympic 14KV genset. It boasts push button controlled traditional wheel steerage through a Sea star hydraulic system coupled to dual, Flanking and Monkey Rudders. From June of 2009 until July of 2014 the boat sat idle due to the owner's illness. It was purchased in 2014 by Vince and Susan McCormick, 2019 by Kevin Daily. Thomas New purchased it in 2022, 2022 by Thomas New and 2023 by Carl Teel.

28. NANNIE JEAN

Th Nannie Jean was built in 1953. She measures 54' x 12'. Her propulsion is a Cummins A2300 and powered by a Westerbeke 8.0 BTD. The drive is coupled

In May of 2010, the vessel ownership was transferred to Red Star Towing Co. of Charleston, WV. In August of 2020, she was purchased by Amherst Madison employee, Brian Patterson who returned the name of the historic vessel to the Nemacolin.

30. P. A. DENNY

The P.A. Denny was built in Charleston, WV, by the Charles Ward Engineering Works in 1930 and named the Scott, after Addison Scott, a New York engineer who oversaw the construction of the lock system on the Great Kanawha River in the 1880's. She was used by the Louisville District of the Army Corps of Engineers as a diesel towboat on the Ohio River for twenty-four years. She has quite

a history of owners and uses. SOLD: 1954, the boat was sold to Howard Powell and Son of Guntersville, Alabama and a great friend to the American Sternwheel Association of Marietta, Ohio. SOLD: 1973, Dunbar, WV coal executive/river man bought the boat with intentions to completely refurbish and use her as a tour boat. Sadly, he passed away in 1975. SOLD: to Lawson Hamilton and The Pratt Mining Company of Hansford, WV and renamed the P.A. Denny in honor of his dear friend. Lawson Hamilton was a major supporter of the Charleston Sternwheel Regatta for many years. DONATED: the P.A. DENNY became a floating marine biology school operated by the ORSANCO GROUP in Cincinnati, Ohio for five years and then came the opportunity for a private sale. SOLD: 2010 to The American Riverboat Co., Capt. "Heck" Heckert and his wife, Sheila Diane Heckert of Parkersburg, WV. It is with great pleasure the Heckert Family is maintaining and enjoying being the keeper of the PA DENNY while going to several Regatta's each year. It should be noted that Capt. Nelson Jones (deceased) worked his first river man deckhand duties aboard the P.A. Denny and was the inspiration for the P.A. Denny's preservation by the Heckert family through the regattas, wherever they might be. Brothers and sisters of the Heckert Fleet, include M/V Sheila "D", Leviathan, G D Eddy, Old Glory, Captain "H", M/V Dixie, Wild Goose, Tammy White, Oliver Merrill, Sam P Sue, Henny Cook, Casino boat M/V Speculation (Captain "Heck" Heckert).

31. PEARL ANN

Capt. Bud Russell of Parkersburg, WV built the vessel in 1987. It was originally named the Oh Susanna after his oldest daughter. Joe and Rosa Moore purchased the boat in the mid-nineties and actually traveled on it to Texas before its return to the Great Kanawha River. Shortly after being launched in 1987, she was lengthened by ten feet, and now measures roughly 18'x 78'. The hull is made out of 3/16" stainless steel and has seven watertight compartments. The living quarters contain a full bathroom, bedroom, satellite TV with 2 flat screen televisions, and a fully equipped galley. The pilot house has a pull out sofa and also serves as sleeping quarters, which is usually utilized by the late night participants. She carries 160 gallons of fuel and 400 gallons of water. The Pearl Anne is powered by a 453 Detroit diesel engine with a Twin Disc 5050 transmission, and has an 11KW Kubota generator. Kris Eads and Tabitha Stutler purchased the boat in 2007 and she was renamed the Pearl

Anne. She had a color scheme change and the addition of an outdoor bar, 19" Carlisle & Finch searchlight, and Kahlenburg horns. Brannon Eads (Kris's brother) purchased the boat in the spring of 2014, after Kris acquired the Miss Sterling from Tom Jones. She was then fitted with a washer/dryer unit, a propane and electric heat source, and now serves as the full time residence for Brannon and his dog Gems. A Furuno 1715 radar system, a Furuno Wass GPS Navigator, and surveillance cameras were added to the pilot house. Her current home port is Pier 54 Marina at mile marker 54.8 on the Great Kanawha River in South Charleston, WV.

32. PRINCESS MARGY

Owner: JD & Anna Basham Home Port: Dunbar, WV, Kanawha River Mile Marker 50.9 RDB | Hull Type: Scow Bow; Material: Steel; Length 80', Width 20', Draft 40" | Wheel: Diameter 13' 6", Width 12', Number of Buckets 16 | Engine Type/Size: 6V-71 200 HP Detroit Diesel engine | Drive Train Type: Hydraulic Pete Grassie started building the all-steel sternwheeler Princes Margy in 1975 at Dunbar, WV, the site of his successful familyrun manufacturing business. When about 75% complete, the hull of the Princess Margy had to be transported by house movers from Dunbar to Charleston across the Patrick Street Bridge and back down MacCorkle Avenue to South Charleston so she could be launched. With this task completed, she made her way down the Kanawha River to her new home in Dunbar at the Grassie residence. By 1980 the Princes Margy was completed. The Princess Margy can hold 1,000 gallons of water and 1,200 gallons of fuel and has a 20 KW GM-Delco, 2-71 generators. The wheel shaft sprocket is 45" with a 6" shaft. The Princes Margy is a three-level self-sufficient live-aboard vessel. The first level consists of a lounge, full-sized kitchen and a half bath. On the second level are a bedroom, bunk room, full- sized bath, and a utility room with full-sized washer and dryer. Enclosed areas are comfortably heated and cooled year around with a 3-ton electric heat pump. The third level is comprised of the pilot house and a large deck. No longer at the forward of the third deck is the 36" muzzle loading, black powder cannon. Firing blank charges, this impressive firearm was mainly used for starting races and other special occasions. Sadly, the infamous cannon exploded upon use in Charleston, WV in 2009. Atop the pilot house are two 8" Kahlenberg trumpet air horns, a 1939 model 14" Carlyle

Finch carbon spotlight and a heavy #3
12" brass bell. Decorative, yet functional, wrought iron railing borders each level complimenting Pete Grassie's original streamlined design of the boat. The Princes Margy has always retained its christened name and remains docked on the Kanawha River at Dunbar. In 2021 the Brannon Eads sold the Princess Margy to JD & Anna Basham and Anna's father Jerry.

33. ROY C

Stanley Cole built the "Roy C" at Parkersburg, West Virginia. Hoyt and Wink Fontalbert currently own her. The "Roy C" is 68' in length and 18' wide. She features a twin split Sternwheel each measuring 36" x 11 ½" driven from a single axle with a Sundstrand hydraulic transmission to a hydraulic motor, through a Braving 18-1 reduction gear to an 18 tooth to 45 tooth chain drive to the wheel, powered by a John Deere four-cylinder engine. The inside is fully equipped for comfort and extended cruising. Her home port is 95 Street, Marmet, West Virginia. If you are in the area, feel free to stop by.

34. RUFUS B II

The Rufus B II was built in 1926 at LeClaire, Iowa on the banks of the Mississippi River. The boat's first owner was Attorney Carl Lamback, and the original name was Freddie Boy. Local legend has it that Attorney Lamback entertained client Al Capone on board. In 1955, Bill Molo purchased the boat and renamed it Bart L and replaced the wood hull with steel. Mr. Molo died in 1960, and the boat was sold that year to Mr. Altman who renamed it William S. Dr. Bettler purchased the boat from Mr. Altman in 1963 and he changed the name to Rufus B II, his wife's nickname. In 1965 the entire boat was remodeled and the hull was widened to 18 feet. The interior is covered with 34" mahogany on the wall and a redwood ceiling. It has two bedrooms, a salon, a complete galley and one and a half baths. In 1991, the Rufus B II was sold to Lou Wendell Marine Sales in St. Albans, WV. The motor was changed to a 671 Detroit diesel with a belt drive and a twin disc transmission. Fuel capacity is 1,400 gallons and the water tank holds 250 gallons. The total length of the boat is 73 feet with a draft of 20 inches. The wheel is 9 feet wide and has 13 buckets. During the 28 years owned by Dr. and Mrs. Bettler, this boat traveled over 30,000 miles, covering the Mississippi, the Tennessee, the Ohio, the Missouri, the St. Croix and the Kanawha Rivers. In 1992, the Rufus B II was

in the Tall Stacks Parade in Cincinnati, Ohio.

35. SEWICKLY

Dravo Corporation at Neville Island, PA built the sternwheel towboat in 1930. She was powered by a 105 x 23 GM6-110 diesel. The original Sewickley, owned by the builder, was sold February 1937 to Captain John Hysmith of Charleston, PA. He sold her in July 1967 to Mon River Towing, Inc. in Belle Vernon, PA. She sold again in 1967 to Harvey Johnson of Monaca, PA. In 1968, she sold to Eugene H. Bartley of Vanport, PA. He sold her to Elmer P. Grimm of Pittsburgh in February 1969. Later in 1969 she was sold to Judd Marine of Cincinnati. She was repowered in 1969 with a 220 hp Allison red. The name was changed in 1973 when Read I. Coen of Cincinnati purchased her and renamed her REED LEE. He sold her in April 2000 to Red Star Towing of Charleston, WV. Finally, she sold to Robert Harrison of Bellaire, OH and her new name is SEWICKLEY.

37. TRAVIS LEE

In an effort to replicate the packet boats of the 1800's, the Kleins' paid great attention to detail when designing their Vessel. Named for their son, the Don Rob't is patterned after Captain Fred Way's vessel, the Betsy Ann and is complete with a gingerbread trimmed pilothouse and eight leaded stained-glass windows. In 1991 the Don Rob't was purchased by Quarry Creek Land Developers. In 2007 the Don Rob't was purchased by Mike Monk. In 2012 the Don

Rob't was purchased by Melvin Lawrence, he and his wife Donna enjoyed the boat as they traveled up and down the Ohio River. The Don Rob't was purchased in 2019 by David and Jo Lynn Martin who renamed it the Travis Lee, for their son who passed away in 2013.

38. VALLEY GEM

The Valley Gem was built 1988-89 by Ivan Arnold and was designed by James E. Sands. The Valley Gem is 157' x 25' (hull 102'x 24.5') and weighs 100 tons. The sternwheel is driven by a 12.7 liter Series 60 Detroit Diesel, which produces 500HP @ 2300 RPM. The engine is coupled to a ZF W325 electronic marine transmission. Total reduction from engine to wheel is 60:1. A 4039 John Deere 40KW Marathon generator provides electricity. The Valley Gem is air conditioned by two 5 ton Carrier units, and is baseboard heated. She carries 1700 gallons of diesel, and 360 gallons of fresh water. The Valley Gem is USCG certified for 300 passengers.

39. WILLIAM D

In July of 2013, John and David Lehew purchased an unfinished hull from Denny Taylor to start building a new sternwheeler because their current sternwheeler Skinney Bill needed major hull repairs. The father and son team decided to build a completely new sternwheeler instead of repairing Skinney Bill so they could make one completely of their own design. In the summer of 2014 Skinney Bill sank; he was raised and sold for scrap. Then the pressure was on to make William D a reality. David completed all the construction work of this new vessel himself. However, he was assisted with the design of the hydraulic system by Sternwheel Captain Tom Faris of the Faris Wheel. William D's hull measures 18 ft by 50 ft with twin 13 ft by 5 ft hydraulically driven wheels for an overall length of 65 ft; bow to the end of wheel framing. The boat is powered by a six-cylinder turbocharged Cummins diesel. William D's drive train is a dual path Eaton pump connected to dual hydraulic motors with a final 5.2 reduction chain drive and a total system reduction of 72 to 1. This vessel is constructed completely out of steel, the wall studs are galvanized, and there is a hidden "hog line" fashioned of 3" structural channel inside the exterior cabin wall. William D has a 12' by 16' pilot house and the deck floor includes a bathroom, bedroom, kitchen, and living room. Owners John and David started construction in August of 2013 with the drive system being put in operation in June 2015 and the interior being completed in August of 2018. The boat's namesake is John's father

and David's grandfather - William David "Skinney" Lehew. He was also the namesake of their previous vessel utilizing his widely known nickname around the Pomeroy, OH area of Skinney. The Ohio River Sternwheel Festival 40th Anniversary was the first festival that William D attended. In July of 2020, David and his wife Wendy put the finishing touches on a 14 ft by 65 ft barge to push with William D. The 45th Ohio River Sternwheel Festival was the barge's first year. The Crew of William D has also been added to; now consisting of Capt. John & Missi, Pilot David along with Wendy and Maycee Lehew.

40. W.P. SNYDER JR.

The W.P Snyder, Jr. is the only steamdriven sternwheel towboat still in the United States river system and is a National Historic Landmark. Built in 1918 to tow coal for the Carnegie Steel Company, she was purchased by the Crucible Steel Company in 1945, and named after the board chairman. Thanks to the work of Fred Way, the Sons & Daughters of the Pioneer Rivermen, and the Ohio Historical Society, she found her current home on the Muskingum in 1955. Although the Ohio River Museum is currently closed as we plan construction of a new museum, guided tours of the WP Snyder will be given during Sternwheel Festival weekend on Friday, Saturday and Sunday from 12-4. Tour wristbands may be purchased at Campus Martius Museum at 601 Second Street for \$5 each. Ohio History Connection, Friends of the Museums and S&D members are free, but must still pick up a wristband at Campus Martius Museum.

MISS KATE

(Not pictured) A new addition to the Ohio River Sternwheel Festival, Miss Kate was built by Jim and Missy Hysel of Middleport, Ohio and finished in August 2024.

The American Sternwheel Association, Inc. (ASA) was founded in January 1976 as a non-profit organization by a small group of enthusiastic sternwheel boat owners. The first meeting was held at the Hotel Lafayette in Marietta, Ohio which has since become the headquarters for the organization.

Membership has increased on a steady basis. The roster now includes members from all over the United States. Members do not need to own a boat, however over a hundred do.

The ASA is an educational and social organization dedicated to the proliferation of paddlewheel vessels. To accomplish this goal, the ASA attempts to inform the public about advantages, typical uses, uniqueness and other reasons for owning a paddlewheel boat. Members supply technical and other assistance to anyone wishing to buy or build a vessel. The ASA also publishes a magazine, "The Sternwheeler", and a newsletter. The magazine contains articles on river events, boats under construction, history and other subjects pertinent to paddlewheel boating. The newsletter keeps members informed of current activities. Most member captains attend regattas to show their boats, participate in races and other competitions and to answer questions.

Although the ASA does not conduct races and regattas, the association serves as a contact between regatta organizers and boat owners. Members' boats take part in many festivals each year including the Ohio River Sternwheel Festival in Marietta, OH the weekend following Labor Day. The Ohio River Sternwheel Festival is the largest gathering of paddlewheel vessels anywhere in the world.

ASA meetings are held every other month: January, March, May, July, September and November. The meetings are normally held at the Hotel Lafayette on the second Saturday. The May and July meetings may be held in other cities or locations by invitation.

A typical ASA weekend starts at 1:00 PM on Saturday with socializing. The Board of Trustees meets at 2:00 PM and the general membership meeting is at 3:00 PM.

Dues are \$25.00 per year for the first member of a family and includes 1 issue of the ASA magazine, "The Sternwheeler" and 5 issues of the ASA Newsletter.

If you enjoy history, river boating, river festivals and the company of some great people, you'll enjoy them all as a member of the American Sternwheel Association.







AMELIA (MIA) WILLIAMS


